IHON ORE PLANT AT VISAKHAPATNAM

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE DEPARTMENT OF PARLIAMENT-ARY AFFAIRS, AND IN THE MI-NISTRY OF SHIPPING AND TRANS-PORT (SARDAR IQBAL SINGH): (a) and (b). The Visakhapatnam Port at present has an iron ore handling plant with an estimated annual capacity of 4.5 million tonnes. Some improvements to the plant, estimated to cost about Rs. 57 lakhs, are being carried out to increase its annual capacity to 6 million tonnes. These works are expected to be completed by October 1969. It is also proposed to develop during' the Fourth Plan period a<sub>n</sub> Outer Harbour at Visakhapatnam capable of handling deep drafted ore carriers with modern ore handling facilities of greater capacity.

### IAC PLANES NOT YIELDING PROFITS

The economics of operation of Indian Airlines are expected to improve with the acquisition of new and profit yielding aircraft. Some routes, though not yielding profit, will still have to be maintained as public services.

- (b) The question of merging the Ashoka Hotels Ltd. and Janpath Hotels Ltd., with the India Tourism Development Corporation, with a view to ensuring co-ordinated development of Hotels in the public sector, is under consideration.
- (c) A reference is invited to the reply given to part (b) of Starred Question No. 186 in the Bajya Sabha on the 26th February, 1969.

#### BENAMTNG OP ANDAMAN ISLANDS
