PRODUCTION OF RAILWAY WAGONS

374. SHRI T. V. ANANDAN: CHAUDHARY A. MOHAMMAD:

Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that wagon builders in the private sector on whom the Indian Railways placed their demands have not fulfilled even one-third of the indented quantity and thus created a bottleneck in Railway transportation;
- (b) if so, the names of these builders along with the number of wagons indented and the number of wagons manufactured by them; and
- (c) what are the terms of agreement and how much money was advanced to them upto the 30th September, 1968?

THE MINISTER OF RAILWAYS (DR. RAM SUBHAG SINGH): (a) There has been a shortfall in supply of wagons from the wagon builders in the private sector. Against total orders of 26,895 in terms of four-wheelers available on 1-4-1967, the production during 1967-68 was 13956. During the first nine months of 1968-69, the production has been 9,871 in terms of four-wheeler units against an order book of 26,439 as on 1-4-1968

This has affected to some extent the clearance of outstanding demands of traffic.
