(c) The staff side raised the issue of restoration of the rates of overtime allowance as admissible before 1st January 1966 in the National Council of Joint Consultative Machinery in February 1968. It was explained to them on behalf of the official side that keeping in view the present financial stringency the restoration of the cut was not possible at the present stage. After some discussion the suggestion of the Chairman that the matter be considered further was accepted. Accordingly, the matter has been considered further but it has not been found possible to restore the cut.]

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF IRRIGATION AND POWER (PROF. SIDDHESHWAR PRASAD): (a) and (b) State Governments have been representing on a number of occasions like State Irrigation Minister's Conference, Annual Plan discussions visit of Union Ministers to States etc., for liberal financial allotment for medium irrigation schemes also.
