**POSTPONEMENT OF MID-TERM ELECTIONS  
IN WEST BENGAL**

(a) whether Government have recently received any representations from any quarters for the postponement of ensuing mid-term elections in West Bengal;

(b) if so, the main features of the representations received; and

(c) what is the reaction of Government thereto?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF LAW (SHRI MOHAMMAD YUNUS SALEEM): (a) Subsequent to the change made in the date of the poll from November, 1968 to

February, 1969 the Election Commission has not received any representation from any quarters for the postponement of the ensuing mid-term elections in West Bengal due to be held on the 9th February, 1969.
