STRIKE IN WEST BENGAL STATE ELECTRICITY BOARD

*142. SHRI A. P. CHATTERJEE: Will the Minister of LABOUR AND REHABILITATION be pleased to state:

(a) whether the employees of the West Bengal State Electricity Board went on an indefinite strike in the month of September, 1968;

(b) if so, the reason therefor; and

(c) the steps taken by Government to settle the dispute?

THE MINISTER OF LABOUR AND REHABILITATION (SHRI JAISUKHLAL HATHI): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) The demands of the employees related to withdrawal of suspension orders and charge-sheets, withdrawal of police cases, scrapping of all penal circulars, guarantee against retrenchment of the existing muster roll employees, grant of full benefit of D.A. to muster roll staff, reinstatement of certain workmen and payment of bonus at the rate of 2 months' basic pay and Dearness Allowance; etc.

(c) A series of conciliation meetings were held by Labour Department of State Government but no settlement could be reached. The strike was, however, called off unconditionally on 12-10-68.

(a) whether it is a fact that the Centre agreed to supply enough rice to Kerala to maintain a 6 oz. ration in the State;

(b) whether the actual supply of rice fell short of commitment every month the aggregate shortfall in the supply during the last one year has come to about 3 lakh tonnes;

(c) whether the failure of the Centre to supply in full the assured quantity of rice has created a serious food situation in the State; and

(d) if so, what steps have been taken by the Centre to ensure adequate supply of rice to the State?
