- (c) whether Co-operatives and Small Industries are included in the priority Sector where ample credit will be available; and
- (d) which institutions are and would be brought under the jurisdiction of the council?

THE DEPUTY PRIME MINISTER AND MINISTER OF FINANCE (SHRI MORARJI R. DESAI): (a) The first meeting of the National Credit Council was held on the 16th March, 1968.

- (b) and (c) The discussions in the first meeting were of a general nature and no firm conclusions were arrived at. A Standing Committee, with the Governor of the Reserve Bank as the Chairman, has been set up by the Council to study the specific issues in regard to credit planning and to formulate concrete proposals for the consideration of the Council at its next meeting.
- (d) The import of the question is not clear. The National Credit Council is an advisory body and is intended to assist the Government and the Reserve Bank in taking appropriate decisions on budgeting and planning of overall credit.
