RESOLUTION GOVERNMENT OF INDIA

IRRIGATION MINISTRY AND **POWER**

New Delhi, the i\$th January, 1968

No. EL. II-x (7)/6s.—With a view to establishing closer relations between suppliers and users of electricity and affording opportunities for consultation relating to the

rvarious aspects of power development in the country, such as generation, transmission and distribution, and also the services provided the"electricity undertakings, Government of India have decided to set up a Central Electricity Consultative Council.

- 2. The composition of the Council will be as under :-
 - (1) Union Minister for Irrigation & Power—Chairman
 - (2) Deputy Minister in the Ministry of Irrigation and Power-Member
 - (3) Five Ministers from State/and/ or Union Territories-Members
 - (4) Five Chairmen of State Electricity Boards-Members
 - (5) Fifteen Members of Parliament— Members
 - (6) Secretary, Ministry of Irrigation and Power-Member
 - (7) Representatives of the Ministerles of the Government of India_ Members
 - (a) Ministry of Railways (Railway Board)!
 - (b)Ministry of Steel, Mines and Metals
 - (i) Department of Iron and Steel. (ii) Department of Mines & Metals.
 - (c) Ministry of Food, Agriculture, Community Development & Cooperation (Depn. of Agriculture)
 - (d) Ministry of Industrial Develtpment and Company Affairs (Deptt. of Industrial Development).
 - (e) Ministry of Finance (Deptt. of Expenditure)
 - (8) Representatives of —-
 - (a) The Planning Commissior.— Member
 - (b) The Heavy Electricals, Bhcpal-Member
 - (c) The Bharat Heavy Electricals Ltd.— Member

- (9) Vice-Chairman, Central Water and Power Commission—*Member*
- (10) President, Federation of Indian Chambers of Commerce & Industry or his representative—*Member*
- (n) A Representative of the Fedearation of Electricity Underatkings of India—Member
- (12) Chairman, Indian Electrical Manufacturers' Association or his representative—*Member*
- (13) Director (FE&P), Ministry of Irrigation and Power—Member. Secretary

Chairman may invite any other person to attend the meetings of the Council as he may consider necessary.

- 3. Inordertoensurefairlyrapidrotation the tenure of the Council may be for two years at a time-
- 4. (a) The Council will consider and make recommendations on the following subjects:—
- (i) Matters relaring to the generation, supply and distribution of electricity and the services and facilities provided by the electricity undertakings as may be referred to it for consideration, by the Union Minister for Irrigation and Power.
- (ii) Other matters relating to the generation, supply and distribution of electricity and the services and facilities provided by the electricity undertakings which individual Members of the Council may, with the approval of the Chairman, desire to be included in agenda.
- (iii) Any other matter of general public interest on public convenience relating to supply and distribution of power.
- (b) The Council will be purely consultative in character.
- (c) Question relating to staff, discipline and appointments shall not be brought before the Council.
- 5. (a) The Council will meet at least once a year.

- (b) The Chairman may constitute committees or sub-committees of the Council to advise the Government on specific problems relating to the servcies and facilities provided by the electricity undertakings.
- (c) Any member wanting to bring up a subject for discussion should give a clear notice of one month to the Secretary and state briefly the subjects to be discussed. The Secretary will circulate the agenda giving the members at least 10 days' notice together, as far as possible, with memorandum on each item. Urgent business may, however be brought forward for consideration without notice but with the approval of the Chairman. The Chairman may rule out a subject to this discretion.
- (d) The proceedings of the meetings of the Council will be confidential, but a short summary of the proceedings will be ordinarily prepared and given to the Press.
- 6. The Members of the Council will draw travelling allowance and daily allowance for attending the meetings of the Council at the rates fixed by the Government from time to time.
