RURAL INDUSTRIAL PROJECTS IN KERALA

803. SHRI KESAVAN (THAZHAVU) : Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state the amount of financial aid given for the development of rural industries to Kerala during the Third Five Year Plan in 1966-67 and so far in 1967-68 ?

THE PRIME MINISTER AND MINISTER OF PLANNING (SHRIMATI INDIRA GANDHI) : Central assistance amounting to Rs. 45.72 lakhs was provided to the Government of Kerala for the Rural Industries Projects programme during the Third Five Year Plan and Rs. 27.62 lakhs during 1966-67. For the current year, 1967-68, an amount of Rs. 19.50 lakhs has been allocated to Kerala State for this Programme.

TIBETAN REFUGEES

804. SHRI M. C. SHAH : Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state the total number of Tibetan refugees who have come over to India, since Chinese occupation of Tibet ?

THE PRIME MINISTER AND MINISTER OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRIMATI INDIRA GANDHI) : The total number of Tibetan refugees who have come over to India since March, 1959 is about 51,000.

805. SHRI V. M. CHORDIA : Will the Minister of DEFENCE be pleased to state :

(a) whether Government's attention has been drawn to the report published on the first page of the Nav Bharat Times dated the 19th November, 1967 under the heading 'Pak Ke Sat Aur Nagaron men Prakshe Pastra Kendra (missile launching centres in seven more cities of Pakistan) and

(b) if so, what is Government's reaction to this report ?]

रक्षा मंत्री (सरदार स्वर्ण सिंह) :

†[THE MINISTER OF DEFENCE (SARDAR SWARAN SINGH) : (a) and (b) It will not be in the public interest to disclose the information which the Government have in their possession on the subject. As mentioned in this House on earlier occasions, Government keep a close watch on all developments having a bearing on our security and take due note thereof in our defence plans.]

SETTING UP OF TRANSMITTERS

806. SHRI SITARAM JAIPURIA : Will the Minister of INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING be pleased to state :

(a) whether there is any proposal to set up four more transmitters in the country; and

(b) if so, the names of the places and the time by when these will be set up ?

THE MINISTER OF INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING (SHRI K. K. SHAH) : (a) and (b) The hon. Member is presumably referring to the four very high power transmitters being set up in the country. Two of these are medium-wave transmitters being set up one each near Calcutta and near Rajkot, which are expected to be commissioned by the end of 1968 and by middle of 1969, respectively. The other two are short-wave transmitters which are being set up near Aligarh and were expected to be commissioned by second half of 1969 will now be commissioned by 1970.

OFFICERS OF CENTRAL INFORMATION SERVICE

807. SHRI D. THENGARI : Will the Minister of INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING be pleased to state :

(a) whether it is a fact that the number of officers in the Central Information Service appointed or promoted against purely *ad-hoc* posts in the ex-cadre services have been and are being given regular appointments in the posts they are holding on *ad-hoc* basis after the completion of certain years of services; and

(b) if so, the steps taken to curb this practice ?

THE MINISTER OF INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING (SHRI K. K. SHAH) : (a) No, Sir. However, since the constitution of the Central Information Service on March 1, 1960, five officers have been given regular appointments in the ex-cadre posts to which they were initially sent on deputation. These posts were regular in character and not of an *ad-hoc* nature. The absorption was made by the concerned Appointing authorities in accordance with their recruitment rules.
