(a) whether Government have received proposals that a live programme of cultural or allied nature in the Sindhi language broadcast from Bhopal-Indore stations in place of mere records of Sindhi songs of artists of Bombay and elsewhere being played as at present from Bhopal and Indore;

(b) whether a list of artists of Madhya Pradesh has been recently supplied to Government from among whom a selection can be made for the above live programme; and

(c) whether Government propose to adopt the above proposal, if not, why not?

MIGRATION CERTIFICATES TO PERSONS IN WEST PAKISTAN

764. SHRI JAIRAMDAS DAULATRAM: Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state:

(a) the number of persons resident in West Pakistan who have been granted Migration Certificates:

(i) in the year 1966; and

(ii) in the year 1967 up to 30th July to leave Pakistan permanently for India,

(b) the number out of these who were Hindus; and

(c) the number of applications for such certificates from Hindus which are pending consideration by Government?

THE PRIME MINISTER (SHRIMATI INDIRA GANDHI): (a) (i) During 1966, 90 Migration Certificates covering 220 persons were granted by our High Commission at Karachi.

(ii) During 1967 up to 30th July, 295 such Certificates were granted covering 1278 persons.

(c) 520 applications from members of minority communities in West Pakistan are pending consideration by the Government.
