THE MINISTER OF INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING (SHRI K. K. SHAH): (a) and (b) In keeping with the secular ideal of the State, only such themes are projected through A.I.R, broadcasts as lend themselves to universal appeal, without any sectarian bias. Besides news, names of places and religious religious occasionally figure in such programmes as talks and devotional music. However, references are made to occasions such as Christmas celebrations in Bethlehem or the Vatican, the Ha] Pilgrimage at Mecca, the Buddhist celebrations in Anuradhapura in Ceylon and the Sikh Pilgrimage at Nankana Sahib in Pakistan. Similarly the mention of His Holiness the Pope or the Delegation of Buddhist Monks from Laos during their recent visits to India would have been made in A.I.R, broadcasts

CHINA'S REJECTION OF INDIA'S PROPOSAL FOR MEETING ON THE BORDER ISSUE

779. SHRI N. R. MUNISWAMY: WiH the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that China has rejected India's offer made after the Nathu La incident of a meeting between the Indian and Chinese Commanders across the Tibet-Sikkim border saying that "it is not necessary";
- (b) if so, what steps will be taken to arrest their aggression on the borders; and
- (c) whether any reasons were assign ed by China for not complying with India's offer?

THE PRIME MINISTER AND MINISTER OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRIMATI INDIRA GANDHI): (a) The Chinese Government have not replied to our notes of the llth and 12th September proposing a meeting between the local Sector Commanders.

(b) and (c) The visits to Australia and New Zealand are exppcted to take place in January 1968, and to Malaysia and Singapore some time later in 1968. No detailed programmes have been drawn up so far. In respect of the other countries, while the invitations have been accepted in principle, the dates of the visits have not so far been decided.
