

(b) The Chinese Charge d'Affaires was called to the Ministry of External Affairs and told that this kind of behaviour was not expected of members of diplomatic missions. He was also told that the recent unilateral and arbitrary action of the Chinese Government in forcibly taking over Gurudwars in Shanghai was greatly resented by all Indians and that they were well within their right in protesting peacefully to a representative of the Chinese Government.
