(b) if so, on which date this was done and on what grounds the film has been exempted from entertainment tax?

THE MINISTER OF INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING (SHRI K. K. SHAH): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) The film was exempted from entertainment tax by the Delhi Administration on 27th September, 1967 for a period of two months which ended on 26th November, 1967. Exemption was granted on the merit of this film as a vehicle of inspiring ideas of patriotism, self-respect and national defence, and was given with a view to helping more people to see the picture and to act as an incentive for production of similar pictures.

ATOMIC POWER STATION ON THE SEA COAST OF SAURASHTRA

•644. SHRI M. C. SHAH: Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state whether the Government of Gujarat has asked the Centre for the establishment of an Atomic Power Station of 600 M.W. of energy, on the seacoast of Saurashtra?

THE PRIME MINISTER AND MINISTER OF ATOMIC ENERGY (SHRIMATI INDIRA GANDHI): A request has been received from the Government of Gujarat for the establishment of u nuclear power station in that State. The Atomic Energy Commission is currently studying the implications of large atomic power stations as sources of low cost energy in India. The suggestion of the Gujarat Government will be considered in the course of these studies along with others.

BIRTH ANNIVERSARY OF NETAJI SUBHAS CHANDER BOSE

- *645. SHRI CH1TTA BASU: Will the Minister of INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING be pleased to state:
- (a) whether Government propose to arrange a special programme over the All India Radio on the occasion of the birth anniversary of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose; and

THE MINISTER OF INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING *'SHRI* K. K. SHAH): fa) Yes, Sir.

(b) Two special feature programmes, one in English "The Rebel" and the other in Hindi and the regional lan guages "Netaji Abroad" are proposed to be arranged centrally and broadcast on the national hook-up on the 23rd lanuary, 1968. Besides, the Calcutta and Cuttack Stations will arrange some additional local programmes on the occasion. Moreover, all Stations will regional news/newsreel provide coverage to the functions that may be held in their respective regions.
