1456. SHRI A. C. GILBERT: Will the Minister of EDUCATION be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government are aware of the report of the University Grants Commission visiting team under letter No. F.9-1(25)/66-CDN, dated July 5/8, 1967, to the Allahabad University stating that there is no Guest House at present in the University and recommending the construction of a Guest House at the cost of one and a half lakh of rupees;
- (b) whether Government are aware that there is an eight double-room Guest House in the Senate House Campus; and
- (c) if the answer to parts (a) and (b) above be in the affirmative, the action taken by the University Grants Commission in the matter?

THE MINISTER OF EDUCATION (DR. TRIGUNA SEN): (a) to (c) The relevant recommendation of the Visiting Committee, set up by the University Grants Commission is reproduced below:

"There is no Guest House at present in the University. The arrangements for the stay of visitors is made in hotels which is quite expensive and inconvenient both to the University and the visitors. The Committee recommends that a Guest House may be provided to the University during the Fourth Plan period".
