REFERENCE TO INDIAN DIPLO-MATS HUMILIATED AND MAN-HANDLED IN PEKING, CHINA

MR. CHAIRMAN: Let the Deputy Minister for External Affairs make the statement now on the expulsion of Indian diplomats from China.

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRI SURENDRA PAL SINGH): Sir, may I make a small submission with your permission? It is true that the Foreign Minister was to have made a statement today in regard to this question of deportation of our diplomats from China. It was thought at that time that we would have fuller information, regarding the events that took place following their deportation from China, before now and we would then come before the House and explain the whole situation. Now the position is that information from our own sources has just begun to come in. We have received only one or two telegrams and they have been deciphered. But we do not possess the fuller information yet but we are hoping that by this evening by 4.30

or 5, the fuller information would have come and we would be in B better position to come before the House and make the statement. Therefore, it is my submission to seek your pel-mission that the statement may be made tomorrow morning, so that we have fuller information to divulge to the House.
