At the Bokaro Township, 600 temporary houses, 500 labour hutments, a guest house, a 50 roomed hostel, 992 permanent houses, a temporary 50-bed hospital, a temporary office building complex, 24 B-type houses for the Soviet specialists and a 200 roomed Bokaro Hotel building have already been constructed. The construction of another 756 permanent houses is nearing completion. The work on the constuction of another 2520 houses including 300 «C type houses for Soviet specialists along work on the construction of another and services, sanctioned in the year 1966-67, has been taken up and is in progess.

- (b) According to the present indications, the entire plant is likely to be commissioned by the end of the fourth quarter of 1971.
- (c) In accordance with the Soviet detailed project report as accepted by the Government, the first phase of the project is a plant with a capaity of 1.7 million tonnes of steel ingots and 880,000 tonnes of foundry iron per annum. In the second phase, the capacity in terms of steel ingots will be raised to 4 million tonnes. The plant will have an inherent capacity for further expansion up to 5 to 6.5 million tonnes and provision has been made in the layout and design so that it can be further expanded up to 10 to 12 million tonnes capacity. '

## FOODGRAINS AT FATE PRICE FOR RAILWAY STAFF IN BIHAR

THE MINISTER OP RAILWAYS (SHRI C. M. POONACHA): The supply of foodgrains to the public (including Railway staff) is primarily responsibility of the State Government. The Railwaymen's Consumer

Cooperative Societies are, however encouraged to run fair price shops to cater to the needs of Railway employees and for this purpose various i'a ililies and assistance are afforded to those Societies by the Railway Administrations. Any difficulties in the supply of foodgrains to che Railway employees are taken up by the Railway Administrations with the concerned State authorities for remedial measures.
