

SERVICE CONDITIONS OF SCIENTISTS IN GOVERNMENT SERVICE

Will the Minister of EDUCATION be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government are aware that the scientists employed in the private sector are paid better than those in Government service; and

(b) if so, the steps taken or proposed to be taken by Government to improve the service conditions of scientists in Government service?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION (SHRI BHAGWAT JHA AZAD) (a) The Council of Scientific and Industrial Research have brought out in March this year an 'Opinion Survey of Scientists and Technologists'. This suggests that scientists employed in private/industrial research establishments are paid better than those in Government service.

(b) The pay structure of scientific posts in different Government organisations have been fixed after taking into consideration all relevant factors

REORGANISATION OF DELHI ARMED POLICE

(b) if so, what are the details of the schemes?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI VIDYA CHARAN SHUKLA)

(a) and (b) The question of reorganising the Delhi Armed Police with a view to streamlining its set-up and

improving its efficiency is under examination of Government. The pattern of reorganisation has not yet been finalised.

SPECIAL HIGH COURT FOR TAX CASES

(a) whether the proposal to have a special High Court to deal with cases pertaining to taxes has been dropped, and

(b) if so, what are the reasons therefor?

THE MINISTER OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI Y B CHAVAN):

(a) There has been no concrete proposal before Government to have a special High Court to deal with cases pertaining to taxes.

CAPTURE OF MIZO HOSTILES

(a) whether Seventy-five Mizo hostiles, including several of their leaders have been captured till May 7th, in the Mizo hills, and

(b) if so, whether there was any casualty among Indian Policemen during the operations?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI VIDYA CHARAN SHUKLA)

(a) Eighty-four Mizo hostiles were captured by the security forces in the Mizo Hills from 1st May, 1967 to 7th May, 1967. These included some important leaders like Lainungawia and Sakhwaliana.

(b) Information is being collected from the State Government.
