(b) whether as a result of this step by the Government of Kerala the Central Government propose z> ->et up their own agency for such police verifications in the State and

(c) whether in this connection Government had any consultations with the non-Congress State Governments?

THE MINISTER OF STATE TN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI VIDYA CHARAN SHUKLA): (a) and (b) The communication received from the Chief Minister, Kerala on this subject is under consideration.

(c) There have been no jonsu'.ta-ticns with any other State Government.

NATIONAL LIBRARY AND NATIONAL ARCHIVES

385. SHRI CHITTA BASU: WII! the Minister of EDUCATION be jleased to state:

(a) whether the National Library, Calcutta and the National Archives are wellequiped to sort out and classify private documents of archival value; and

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION (PROF. SHER SINGH): (a) and (b) Yes, Sir.

TEACHING OF SCIENCE SUBJECTS

(a) whether it is a fact ...hat the policy of teaching of science subjects is reviewed from time to time by the Government of India; and

THE MINISTER OF EDUCATION (DR. TRIGUNA SEN): (a) Yes, Sir. All educational matters including the teaching of science are constantly reviewed.

(b) The necessary data and information are in the main collected with the assistance of the University Grants Commission at the university stage and with that of the National Council of Educational Research and Training, at the school stage. A National Council of Science Education has also been set up to assist in the over-all cc-ordina-tion of science education programmes.
