AIR SERVICE THROUGH BHUJ AIR-FIELD

414. DR. B. N. ANTANI: Will the Minister of TOURISM AND CIVIL AVIATION be pleased to whether Bhuj Air-field which was temporarily suspended for repairs and expansion is now ready civil for traffic and if so, the steps taken by Government for resumption of traffic through this air-field?

OF TOURISM THE MINISTER AVIATION (DR. AND CIVIL KARAN SINGH): The airfield Bhuj has now been declared fit and the Indian Airlines Corporation will commence operating service to that place with effect from 6th, June, 1967.

Work on BUCKINGHAM CANAL AND COOUM RIVER

Will 415. SHRI T. V. ANANDAN: the Minister of TRANSPORT AND to state SHIPPING pleased be whether it is a fact that the dredging and deepening work of the Buckingham Canal and the Cooum river in Madras State for providing a useful communication between waterway Andhra and Madras has been delayed for want of concurrence of the Union Government?

THE MINISTER OF TRANSPORT AND SHIPPING (PROF. V. K. R. V. RAO): Inland Waterways fall in the State sector and programmes for their development have been included in the draft Fourth Five-Year Plan.

At the time of formulation various new water-transport schemes for inclusion in the 4th Plan, the Government of Madras put forward proposals for carrying out improvements to Buckingham Canal at a total cost of Rs. 470 lakhs. These proposals were scrutinised in the Inland Water-Transport Directorate and the State Government were advised to make an assessment of the traffic potentialities of the Buckingham Canal in view of the large outlay proposed for its improvement. The State Government have constituted a Special mittee to go into the traffic potentialities of the Waterways and its final report is awaited. Andhra Pradesh Government have also put forward proposals for improving the portion of the Buckingham Canal lying in their State at a cost of Rs. 130 lakhs. They were also requested to submit a project report with cost benefit statements. This report has not yet been received.
