

CONVERSION OF SUB-POST OFFICES INTO HEAD P.O.S IN MADHYA PRADESH

633. SHRI K. C. BAGHEL: Will the Minister of COMMUNICATIONS be pleased to state the number of sub-post offices which are likely to be converted into Head Post Offices and Branch Post Offices in Madhya Pradesh during 1967-68?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENTS OF PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS AND COMMUNICATIONS (SHRI I. K. GUJRAL): Six Sub-Post Offices are likely to be converted into Head Post Offices during 1967-68. No Sub-Post Office is proposed to be converted into a Branch Post Office during 1967-68.

VIKRAM UNIVERSITY

635. SHRI RAMPRASANNA RAY: Will the Minister of EDUCATION be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that the Vikram University has approached the University Grants Commission for sanctioning some posts of Heads of various Departments of Arts Faculty; and the Committee of the U.G.C. visited the University in November, 1966;

(b) whether it is a fact that the said Committee submitted its report few months back but the Commission

has not so far taken a decision thereon; and

(c) by when a decision is expected to be taken on the report of the Committee?

THE MINISTER OF EDUCATION (DR. TRIGUNA SEN):

(a) to (c) The Vikram University placed a proposal for Professorship for each of the Departments of Political Science, English, Sanskrit, Hindi and Economics before the Visiting Committee which was appointed by the University Grants Commission to assess the requirements of the University for the Fourth Five Year Plan. The Committee visited the University in November, 1966 and submitted its report towards the end of January, 1967. This will be considered by the Commission at their next meeting in July, 1967.
