POST OFFICES IN BORDER AND BACKWARD AREAS OF BIHAR

667. SHRI B. N. MANDAL: Will the Minister of COMMUNICATIONS be pleased to state:

(a) the number of new post offices which will be opened in the border and backward areas of Bihar during Fourth Five Year Plan and how many of them in the backward districts of Saharsa in that State; and

(b) whether Government have prepared the list of location of those post offices in the district of Saharsa?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENTS OF PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS AND COMMUNICATIONS (SHRI I. K. GUJRAL): (a) 638 Post Offices are likely to be opened in border areas and areas treated as 'Very Backward' by the P&T Department. Opening of Extra Departmental Branch Offices will depend upon the removal of the existing restrictions placed due to the financial stringency. Saharsa District is not treated as 'Very Backward' for the purpose of expansion of postal facilities. 62 Post Offices are likely to be opened in Saharsa Distt.
