of the units near Betul Project where new migrants were being settled in sizeable numbers and to ascertain market prospects of the products with reference to the experience of the existing units in the State, manufacturing siimilar items.

Following further discussions in December, 1966, a revised proposal was received in January, 1967, from the State Government for setting up of 13 Industrial units near Betul for the employment of 451 new migrants at an estimated cost of about Rs. 36.33 lakhs and of 21 industrial units at Itarsi for the employment of 841 new migrants at an estimated cost of Rs. 40.72 lakhs

While forwarding the revised proposal, the State Government had indicated that the economics and marketing facilities will have to be considered carefully. The State Government have been requested to indicate whether these aspects have been examined and if so, which of the 34 schemes they would recommend in the light of such examination. In view of the shortage of funds, the State Government are also being requested to indicate an order of priorities for the schemes, for phasing the expenditure, keeping in view the ratio 'of capital investment to employment potential.

SCHOLARSHIPS TO FOREIGN STUDENTS

- (c) Out of ten recommendations, eight have already been implemented. Ag regards the formation of an Advisory Council at Agency level, a Regulation is expected to be promulgated shortly.
- (d) The NEFA Civil Service is already in existence.
 - (e) Yes Sir.

THREAT BY ASSAM HILL PEOPLES CONFERENCE

- 723. SHRI BHUPINDER SINGH: WUI the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:
- (a) whether Government's attention has been drawn to the reported threat of 'direct action* held out by the Assam* Hill Peoples Conference, if their demands are not met by the 13th July, 1967; and
- (b) if so, the reaction of Government thereto?

THE MINISTER OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI Y. B. CHAVAN): (a) and (b) Perhaps the reference is to the report which appeared in the •Asam Tribune', dated the 28th May, 1967, according to which the All Party 892 R.S.D.—5.

Hill Leaders Conference is likely to revive its threat of direct action if the Centre fails to find an acceptable solution to the hill problem before July 13. The Government hope that such a situation would not arise and the people concerned would appreciate that a matter like this cannot be settled by direct action or any other kind of agitation.
