

(a) whether Government's attention has been drawn to a Press Report appearing in the *Times of India* dated the 19th May, 1967 to the effect that tea industry is receiving raw deal at the hands of British planters;

(b) if so, what action Government propose to take in this regard; and

(c) what are the details of the action proposed to be taken?

THE MINISTER OF COMMERCE (SHRI DINESH SINGH): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) and (c) Government are constantly engaged in finding ways and means for improving production and export performance of Indian teas which are facing serious competition in the markets abroad.

A Committee under the Chairmanship of Shri P. C. Borooah has been set up for this purpose and a Seminar under the auspices of Indian Institute of Foreign Trade and the Tea Board has just been concluded.

#### MANUFACTURE OF PAPER COVERED COPPER CONDUCTOR PLANT

(a) whether it is a fact that the Madhya Pradesh State Industries Corporation had requested for the grant of industrial licence for the manufacture of paper covered copper conductor plant as ancillary industry of Heavy Electricals Ltd., Bhopal for which a letter of intent was issued;

(b) if so, what is the present position of the case, the exact nature of difficulty experienced by Government of India in the matter of grant of industrial licence; and

(c) when the matter is likely to be finalised?

THE MINISTER OF INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AND COMPANY AFFAIRS (SHRI FAKHRUDDIN ALI AHMED): (a) to (c) The firm submitted their proposals for import of plant and machinery for a capacity of 1200 tons on a single shift basis. They were asked to review the scheme on the basis of same capacity on a double shift basis. Their revised proposals are awaited. The issue of an industrial licence will be considered after the revised proposals are received.
