THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION (SHRI BHAGWAT JHA AZAD): (a) Since this scheme is now an activity transferred to the State Governments. it is the responsibility of the State Governments to open new Vijnan Mandirs in their States. The Government of Madhya Pradesh have intimated that they have no proposals for increasing the number of Vijnan Mandirs during the Fourth Plan.

FUNCTIONS OF CENTRAL RESERVE POLICE AND HOME GUARDS

- 823. SHRI BHUPINDER SINGH: Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:
- (a) the roles performed by Central Reserve Police and the Home Guards respectively;
- (b) whether there is any overlapping in their functions; and

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI VIDYA CHARAN SHUKLA): (a) The Central Reserve Police is an armed police force meant for use in the maintenance of law and order in any area within the territory of India. The Home Guards Organisation, on the other hand, serves as an auxiliary to the civil police in serving the community during emergencies like air raids, fires, floods, epidemics, etc. and in the maintenance and protection of essential services.

(b) and (c) No, Sir. Their functions are quite distinct and different.
