SHRI Y. B CHAVAN. Of course. whether it is implemented or not is a different matter but as far as priorities are concerned the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes or the landless people are on the priority list If he has got any specific case in mind I would like him to communicate with me

SHRI AKBAR ALI KHAN Sir, the Home Minister has said that in addition to the efforts that are being made by the Government, efforts also be made by public leaders of all parties. In the course of the discussion on the Report a suggestion was made that a Committee under the Chairmanship of Mr G Ramachandian. Secretary of the Gandhi Foundation, should be set up consisting of all political parties in Parliament I would like to know whether that has come to the notice of the Home Minister and if so, what his reattion is to that

SHRI Y B CHAVAN My reaction at present is nil because really speaking I do not know about this proposal.

consisting of 3000 lines which was to be installed at Ernakulam and the other at Shillong, have since been set up, and

(b) if not, by when they will be set up?]

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENTS OF PARLIAMENT-ARY AFFAIRS AND COMMUNICATIONS (SHRI I. K. GUJRAL). (a) The 3,000 lines Automatic Exchange at Ernakulam and the 2,000 lines Automatic Exchange at Shillong are both under installation

(b) Both these exchanges are likely to be commissioned by the middle of 1968

SHRI I K GUJRAL. Sir, while it may be difficult for me to give complete list where we are going to use cross-bai exchanges, I can say this that increasingly we are shifting to cross-bar wherever we are installing new equipment This year the Indian Telephone Industry will be in a position to manufacture approximately seventy thousand lines for various exchanges and we are alloting priorities Wherever we are installing new exchanges we go in for the cross-bar and wherever expansion takes place we stick to the old one

SHRIMATI C AMMANNA RAJA. I do not know what this cross-bar installation means, but I want to ex-

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press my difficulties. Whenever 1 want to speak to Hyderabad I am told that the line is out of order is there any means of rectifying this? It is gusting that every morning or every night I am told this Being the only woman away from home, I have so many responsibilities at home . . .

AN HON MEMBER: Women are operating the telephone

SHRIMATI C. AMMANNA RAJA Why are you excited about it? I want to know whether you can do something to rectify this.

SHRI I. K. GUJRAL. So far as the 'cross-bai is concerned, I will try to explain it to the hon Member in one word This is an age of computerisation Therefore, in the modernisation of the exchanges a new system has been evolved whereby a so-called central brain is established takes the entire information with regard to the called number and then noutes the call directly or via alternative routes to the destination This is the latest system and it is easier to maintain. This is the technical aspect of it So far as Hyderabad is cerned, I will definitely take note of what the hon. Member has said I can assure her of one thing more

SHRIMATI C AMMANNA RAJA Why not have an alternative line?

SHRI I. K. GUJRAL. We are trying to put up a complete network of automatic trunk dialling in all the main cities and commencing by about next year it will be possible for us to have direct dialling between such of the cities as are connected to those (xchanges

SHRI A. M TARIQ: I would like to know from the hon Minister whener the Department has purchased this cross-bar exchange and, if so, from which country and how much foreign xchange is involved May I know thether global tenders were invited or the cross-bar exchange?

SHRI I. K. GUJRAL: In the earlier stages we entered into a collaboration agreement with the Bell Telephone Manufacturing Company, Belgium We are now manufactuling it ourselves in the ITI We only initially imported to learn the know-how Now the ITI is manufacturing it and we have achieved self-sufficiency

to Questions

K CHANDRASEKHARAN Is the hon Minister aware that the Ernakulam exchange, operated as a manual exchange, is very badly inadequately staffed and on account of the same the subscribers are put to a great deal of trouble Even calls in respect of fire services are being attended to on account of the inadequacy of staff to a large extent and to some extent due to the negli gence of the operators in the kulam telephone exchange and as a result a big dramatic tent and equipment were completely lost fire The telephone operators refused to put a call through to the fire service station in time recently at Ernakulam

SHRII K GUJRAL: As the hon Member knows there are three changes, in the area viz one in Cochin, the second in Willingdon Island and the third in Ernakulam proper Now, Willingdon Island and Cochin have already got automatic exchanges So far as Ernakulam is concerned, we are now making it automatic and by about the middle of next year it will be fully automatic So far as the services of the operators are concerned, well, I very much regret that are not up to the mark, but the hon Member will agree with me that most of it has a political slant about it and for which the hon Member's Party is partly responsible

JAIPURIA: The SHRI SITARAM hon Minister mentioned earlier about the modernisation of the telephone exchanges I would like to know from the hon Minister what exactly is the difficulty in this You can have direct dialling from here to Banaras or from here to Kanpur and some other places 4731

but why is it there is no direct telephone dialting system from Banaras to Mognal Sarai or from Brindaban to Mathura, which is within a distance of 8 miles?

SHRI I. K. GUJRAL: So far modernisation is concerned, the hon. Member will agree with me that telecommunication itself is modernisation. So far as the improvement of certain lines is concerned, there are two basic aspects of it. Originally we started with all the lines being overhead copper wires. Due to the vulnerability of overhead lines to frequent interruptions and thefts, we are increasingly shifting to underground cables or the microwave system. By the end of Fourth Plan we expect to complete about 17,000 kms. of microwave and coaxial cables on various trunk routes. About the suggestion that the hon. Member mentioned, I am not in a position to straightway say when they will make that section automatic, but I will make a note of it.

SHRI K. CHANDRASEKHARAN: In view of the political aspect of the reply given by the hon. Minister my earlier question, may I ask the hon. Minister what he means by that and secondly may I ask the hon. Minister whether he knows that on account of the absolute inadequacy of staff in the Ernakulam telephone exchange, the staff is put to great trouble and the facilities normally to be provided to the telephone operators in a commercial town like Ernakulam are not being provided and attended to by the P and T Department

SHRI I. K. GUJRAL: This was exactly what I mentioned as politics being brought in. So far as staff is concerned, it is not inadequate, because staff is provided according to the yardstick fixed by us. The complaint has been caused due to various movements there and the staff has not been working properly. The hon. Member himself knows that two weeks before there was some trouble about "go slow", which caused some inconveniences to the subscribers, which we regret very much. But you should understand that one reason . .

SHRI K. CHANDRASEKHARAN: I deny it.

SHRI I. K. GUJRAL: Let me finish. It was not motivated by any inadequacy of staff. It was primarily motivated by things other than services.

SHRI BHUPESH GUPTA: The hon. Minister . . .

SHRIMATI DEVAKI GOPIDAS: Mr. Chairman, Sir . . .

MR. CHAIRMAN: I have given him permission.

SHRI BHUPESH GUPTA: If the Kerala lady wants to speak, let her.

MR. CHAIRMAN: No Kerala lady. You speak.

SHRI B. K. P. SINHA: Sir, I have a point of order. Read the heading of the question. It is "Crossbar telephone exchanges in Ernakulam Shillong." Read the contents. question does not arise either out of the heading or out of the contents and I do not know how it is being permitted.

SHRI BHUPESH GUPTA: "Crossbar" is there and my question relates to "cross-bar". There is cross conversation . . .

SHRI G. MURAHARI: Cross-talk.

SHRI BHUPESH GUPTA: Is there any bar? I should like to know whether we are going to have that kind of assurance where not only the crossbar problem will not be there, also this kind of interruption and interference with the telephone munication will not be there. It has become one of the greatest risks in our communication system.

Oral Answers

SHRI I. K. GUJRAL: I would like to take this opportunity first to categorically deny that there is any tapping going on. The hon. Member unfortunately suffers from some sort of an obsession. The difficulty at the moment is that whenever there is a slight defect in the mechanism, or a small disturbance, or a tick of noise that comes, the hon, Member thinks that tapping is going on. I would like to assure him that no tapping is going on, and we are not at all interested in what the hon. Member says on the writes more telephone because he often.

SHRI BHUPESH GUPTA: Dr. B. C. Roy once told the present Chief Minister, Shri Jyoti Basu, "your telephone had been tapped; what you already had talked to Delhi I had got".

SHRIMATI DEVAKI GOPIDAS: With the cross-bar arrangement Delhi we get so much of cross talks. Without the cross-bar we get that in Kottayam and other places also. would like to ask the hon. Minister what are the remedies he is envisaging. It becomes so difficult. In the case of trunk calls which are made to the South, we find it very difficult to get it; it is not audible. What are the remedies?

SHRI I K GUJRAL: The hon. Member is mixing up cross-bar and cross talk. These are two different things, and cross-bar is a remedy to stop the cross talk The main difficulty at the moment is that there is so much of pressure on the lines that cometimes calls do get mixed up. At the moment we are taking steps to ee that the service improves, and I hope in the near future we will be able to give satisfaction.

SHRI KOTA PUNNAIAH: May know whether the Government have issued instructions to the telephone operators only to speak in Hindi and not in English? Whenever I wanted to book a call or whenever I wanted to take the help or assistance on a directory reference, they only speak in Hindi. Even after my explaining the difficulty of my not understanding Hindi, the operators are not co-operating with me. They only speak in Hindi. I do not know the plight of the foreigners, leave aside the question of people from non-Hindi-speaking areas

MR. CHAIRMAN: This question does not arise from this. You have stated vour grievance. That is all right.
