- (iv) About 4,500 villages were raised above High Flood levels.
- (v) Anti-sea erosion works were carried out to protect about 36 miles of sea coast in Kerala.

The measures undertaken have provided protection to about 50.6 lakh hectares (125 lakh acres) of land.

(d) The Central Government advances long-term loans to State 'Governments for meeting the expenditure on approved flood control (including drainage, works antiwaterlogging and anti-sea erosion works). The total expenditure in the Flood Control Sector up to the end of the Third Plan was Rs. 147.40 crores. The anticipated expenditure dering 1966-67 is Rs. 13.18 crores.

BLACK LISTING OF U.P.C.C.

1017. SHRI M. P. BHARGAVA: Will the Minister of WORKS, HOUS-ING AND SUPPLY be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that the United Provinces Commercial Corporation was black-listed by the former Ministry of Supply and Technical Development;

(b) what were the reasons for 'this black-listing; and

(c) whether the black-listing has caused loss of export of sillimanite to the tune of Rs. 50 lacs?

THE MINISTER OF WORKS, HOUSING AND SUPPLY (SHRI JAGANNATH RAO): (a) Yes Sir.

(b) The firm had obtained 90 per cent advance payments in respect of over 400 road rollers on inspection but had failed to despatch these. These road rollers are not physically available in the firm's premises and the firm has also not refunded the advanced payments received by it.

(c) No information is available with this Ministry on this point.906 RS-4.

RAGHURAMAIAH): (a) and (b) In view of the high prices of raw materials and the consequent mcrease in the cost of production of catfeine, which was the principal item of manufacture according to the production programme, the Phyto Chemicals Factory proposed to be set up at Neriyamanglam has been abandoned.
