AERIAL SPRAY ON COTTON FIELDS

Written Answers

- 23. SHRI NARINDER SINGH BRAR: Will the Minister of FOOD AND AGRICULTURE be pleased to state:
- (a) whether he had discussed some proposals with the Minister of Petroleum and Chemicals to make arrangements for aerial spray on cotton fields with State Governments' cooperation on a no-profit and no-loss basis and to recover the spraying charges;
- (b) if so the details of the talks held;
- (c) whether the State Governments have been approached in this matter: and
- (d) if so, what is the reaction of the State Governments?

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF FOOD. AGRICULTURE COMMUNITY DE- VELOPMENT AND COOPERATION (SHRI ANNASAHEB SHINDE):

(a) to (d) No such discussion took place. However under the existing rules aerial spraying of cotton is subsidised. Wherever the planes of Government of India are used for the work a nominal rate of Rs. 2 per acre is charged. Where planes of the private sector are engaged the cost of spraying is subsidised by the Government of India to the extent of 66-2/3 per cent. This is in addition to the subsidy on pesticides which the State Governments might give.
