MOTION FOR ELECTION TO THE CENTRAL ADVISORY BOARD OF EDUCATION AND PROGRAMME THEREOF

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION (SHRI BHAGWAT JHA AZAD): I beg to move the following motion:

"That in pursuance of sub-clause (d) of clause (2) of paragraph 8 of the Government of India (Education, Health and Lands Department) Resolution No. F.122-3/35-E, dated the 8th August, 1935, as amended, this House do proceed to elect, in such manner as the Chairman may direct, one member from among the members of the House to be a member of the Central Advisory Board of Education."

The question was put and the motion was adopted.

if necessary, to the Central Advisory Board of Education:

1. Number of Members to be elected . . . One
2. Last date and time for receiving nominations. April 5, 1967 (up to 3 P.M.)
3. Last date and time for withdrawal of candidature. April 6, 1967 (up to 3 P.M.)
4. Date and time of election. April 7, 1967 (Between 3 P.M. and 5 P.M.)
5. Place of election . . . Room No. 63, First Floor, Parliament House, New Delhi.
6. Method of election . . . Proportional representation by means of the single transferable vote.

SHRI BANKA BEHARY DAS: I want one clarification from the Minister because this Nagaland affair is still being administered by the External Affairs Ministry and there is a lot of misunderstanding among the people of this country, especially, the rebels, who are taking advantage of this and telling everybody that they are not part of India because had they been part of India then this affair would have been administered by the Home Ministry. In this connection, I wish to refer to the Panel Report of the Administrative Reforms Committee which has been published to-day. The Committee has also recommended that this affair should be administered by the Home Ministry. So I would like to know from the Minister whether the Government, after passing this measure, would seriously consider to take steps to allay the suspicion created among the people of this country, particularly the rebels, by transferring this matter to the Home Ministry.

SHRI A. P. CHATTERJEE (West Bengal): Mr. Chairman, Sir, I raised a point of order on the last day, that is to say, on Friday last, when this motion was moved for consideration by the External Affairs Minister.

MR. CHAIRMAN: I think the point of order must have been disposed of by the presiding officer.

SHRI A. P. CHATTERJEE: It was not disposed of. The Vice-Chairman, Mr. Akbar Ali Khan, merely said . . .
