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THE MINISTER OF COMMERCE (SHRI DINESH SINGH): (a) and (b) During the discussions that were held in November 1966 with an Italian delegation led by their Minister of Foreign Trade, the Indian delegation impressed upon the Italian delegation the need for eliminating the various tariff and non-tariff barriers now in existence both in Italy and in the European Economic Community, of which Italy is a member. In particular, the need to abolish, or at least substantially reduce, the heavy import duties on items of export interest to India such as tropical products, black pepper, silk fabrics, jute and coir manufactures was emphasised, an the Government of Italy were urged to use their good offices to persuade the Community to do likewise in the course of the Kennedy Round negotiations. An aide memoire incorporating the various suggestions was also presented to the Italian delegation.

Since then, the matter has been pursued through our Embassy in Rome and through our Economic Mission in Brussels, and discussions have also taken place on the basis of the offers made by the Community in regard to duty reductions. These discussions are proposed to be pursued in Geneva as part of the Kennedy Round talks and also at the meeting of the Indo-Italian Joint Commission which is expected to take place in New Delhi sometime in April, 1967.

OVERCROWDING IN TRAINS STARTING FROM DELHI/NEW DELHI

- 54. SHRI JAGAT NARAIN: Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to state:
- (a) whether it is a fact that there is heavy over-crowding in the trains starting from Delhi/New Delhi Railway particularly in Srinagar Express;
- (b) if so, how does the number of tickets issued for trains starting from Delhi/New Delhi compare with the reserved/unreserved capacity of the trains; and

- (c) the steps proposed to be taken to meet this over-crowding?
- THE MINISTER OF RAILWAYS (SHRI C. M. POONACHA): (aJ There overcrowding on cer Mail and Express trains starting J Delhi/New Delhi while a number >f passenger trains and shuttles are fully occupied. 59 Up Srinagar press is overcrowded during Summer.
- (b) In view of 24 hours booking in force both at Delhi Main and N < *particulars Delhi Stations. of ac sale of tickets particular tra are not easily determinable.
- (c) Introduction of additional and/or augmentation of existing; vices, with a view to relieve crowding, is done to the extent op . rationally feasible and justified traffic. Additional works have accord ingly been planned in Delhi are:: operational difficulties overcome present existing augmenting vices.

STRIKE BY WORKERS OF GUNTAK TRANSHIPMENT SHED

- 55. SHRI P. K. KUMARAN: Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be plea to state:
- (a) whether there was a strike the workers of Guntakal transhipment shed in January, 1967:
- (b) if so, what are the grievan of the workers;
- (c) whether any of their denial" have been conceded; and
- (d) if not, what other steps ha been taken in the matter?

THE MINISTER OF RAILWAYS (SHRI C. M. POONACHA): (ai No Railway employee in Guntakal Transhipment Shed struck wo however about 150 piece rated labourers who are not regular Railway servants but who are paid on the bai of weight lifted by them, absented themselves on the 1st and 2nd January, 1967.
