PRODUCTION OF COTTON CLOTH

»74. SHRI R. P. KHAITAN: Will the Minister of COMMERCE be pleased to state:

(a) the total production of cotton cloth in the country upto the end of December, 1966;

(b) the quantity exported upto the end of December, 1966 and the earnings therefrom; and

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE (SHRI M. SHAFI QURESHI): (a) Total production of cotton cloth during the year, 1966. by cotton textile mills, Powerlooms and Handlooms is estimated at 7,336 million metres.

(b) The exports of cotton piece goods during the year, 1966, stood at 4276.4 lakhs square metres valued at Rs. 4940.5 lakhs.

(c) The *per capita* availability for the year 1966 is estimated at 13.77 metres.
