On experience gained with the earlier built ICF First Class Coaches, the following further improvements are being incorporated in new builds, as additional amenities to passengers

- (1) Wash basins in compartments of a limited number of coaches, to get service experience with this arrangement
- (11) A separate cubicle to serve as accommodation for attendents and to keep meal "thalis", drinking water container and limited storage space for passengers' luggage
- (111) The clear space between the coach floor and the bottom of the lower berth is being increased slightly to facilitate storage of boxes and luggage.
- (1v) The bed-cum-back rests and seats to be of reduced thickness by using denesr foam rubber so that with the bed
