THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF WORKS HOUSING AND SUPPLY (SARDAR IQBAL SINGH): (a) The following steps have been taken to popularise Hotel Ranjit: ---

- (i) Wide publicity has been given in newspapers and magazines;
- (ii) Improvement in the service facilities:
  - (a) Reception lounge has been air-conditioned.
  - (b) Telephones in the rooms have been increased from 35 to 85.
  - (c) Bar service facilities to the extent permissible under the Delhi Excise Rules have been provided.
  - (d) Some of the residential rooms have been air-conditioned and some more are being air-conditioned.
  - (e) Service facilities to the clients have been progressively improved.
- (b) Hotel Ranjit was inaugurated in November 1965, with 100 beds only, and was commissioned to full capacity of 242 beds during September-October, 1966. The average occupancy has increased from 40 per cent during July-September, 1966 to 48 per cent during October, 1966 to February, 1967.
- (c) 1966-67 will be the first complete financial year of the Hotel and the financial results for this year will be known only at the close of the vear.
