

INDIAN Show ROOMS ABROAD

*184. SHRI M. D. NARAYAN: Will the Minister of COMMERCE be pleased to state:

(a) the details of the Government of India Show Rooms and Trade Centres existing abroad at present;

(b) how many of them are being supervised by the Ministry of Commerce and the number of those that are linked with and supervised by Indian Embassies; and

(c) the amount of orders received and supplied through these agencies?

THE MINISTER OF COMMERCE (SHRI DINESH SINGH): (a) to (c) A statement is placed on the Table of the House.

STATEMENT

(a) The following is a list of Showrooms/Trade Centres maintained by the Government of India.

1. Cairo (U.A.R.) Trade Centre.
2. Baghdad (Iraq).
3. Beirut (Lebanon).
4. Bangkok (Thailand).
5. Tehran (Iran).
6. Lagos (Nigeria).
7. Kabul (Afghanistan).
8. Jeddah (Saudi Arabia).
9. Khartoum (Sudan).
10. Bahrain (Persian Gulf).

(b) All these Showrooms are at present directly supervised by Indian Missions, but it has been decided to transfer S. Nos. 1—7 to the State Trading Corporation of India and to close down S. Nos. 8 and 9 with effect from 1-4-1967. The future of the Showroom at S. No. 10 is under examination.

(c) Trade enquiries received as a result of displays in the Showrooms/ Trade Centres are immediately passed on to the Indian exporters concerned who get directly in touch with

foreign importers. Since Indian businessmen or foreign importers do not generally report to the Showroom authorities or this Ministry the business secured by them as a result of these trade enquiries, it is not possible to assess separately the volume of business materialising through Showrooms,

EXPORT OF TEA TO U.K.

•137. SHRI G. R. PATIL: Will the Minister of COMMERCE be pleased to refer to the answer given to Starred Question No. 625 in the Rajya Sabha on 8th December, 1966 and state:

(a) the total quantity of tea exported to United Kingdom during the year 1966-67;

(b) whether there has been a shortfall in export of tea to that country; and

(c) if so, what are the reasons therefor?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE (SHRI M. SHAFI QURESHI): (a) and (b) During the first eleven months of 1966-67, India's exports of tea to U.K. stand tentatively at 96.3 million kilograms as against her export of 98.4 million kilograms during the corresponding period of 1965-66. The shortfall is 2.1 million kgs.

(c) 'In 1966 U.K. imported about 234 million kgs. of tea as against 254 million kilograms in 1965. Her purchases from the African countries in 1966 were also higher than those in 1965. Consequently there is a fall in the share of India in the U.K. market.
