

# HOUSES FOR INDUSTRIAL WORKERS IN PUNJAB

\*596. SHRI UTTAM SINGH DUGGAL: Will the Minister of WORKS, HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

(a) whether some additional amount has been given by Government to the Government of Punjab in 1966 for the construction of houses for industrial workers; and

(b) if so, the total amount so far given?

THE MINISTER OF WORKS, HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT (SHRI MEHR CHAND KHANNA): (a) and (b) Presumably, the reference is to the allotment of L.I.C. funds to the Punjab Government in 1966-67. A sum of Rs. 60 lakhs was allocated to the united Punjab in September, 1966. After formation of two separate States of Punjab and Haryana, this amount was to be divided between them in the proportion of 60 : 40, i.e., Rs. 36 lakhs would have remained with the Punjab Government and Rs. 24 lakhs would have been transferred to the Haryana Government. On the request of the Governor, Punjab, a further sum of Rs. 20.0 lakhs has been allocated to Haryana and the Punjab Government have been requested to transfer Rs. 12 lakhs to Haryana from their allocation of Rs. 60.0 lakhs. Thus, Punjab will get Rs. 48 lakhs and Haryana will get Rs. 32 lakhs out of a total allocation of Rs. 80.0 lakhs.

## STATEMENT

(a) The following are the hydel/thermal projects now under construction in Andhra Pradesh. Their probable date of commissioning is also indicated against each:

| 1. Upper Sileru Hydro Electric Project (2x60 MW)     | 1st set is expected to be commissioned in August, 1967 followed by second in December, 1967.  |

| 3. Balimela Dam Project . . . .                      | Dam is likely to be completed by 1970-71. The scheme for setting up of power station at the foot of the Dam is likely to materialise early in V Plan. |

| 6. Kothagudam Thermal Scheme— Stage I (2 x 60 MW)    | Both the sets have been commissioned. 1st set was commissioned on 4-7-66 and the other on 26-11-66.   |
| 7. Kothagudam Thermal Scheme— Stage II (2 x 60 MW)   | The 1st is expected to be commissioned in May, 1967 and the 2nd in September, 1967.   |
| 8. Kothagudam Thermal Scheme— stage III (3 x 60 MW)  | Planned to be completed during the IV Plan.   |

(b) The total installed generating capacity in the State at the end of the III Plan was 307 MW. An additional generating capacity of 422.5 MW is likely to be added during IV Plan from the continuing generation schemes; a further 180 MW (3 x 60 MW) from Kothagudam Thermal Scheme Stage III, and 100 MW from Lower Sileru Hydro Electric Project will also be added during the current Plan, bringing the total installed generating capacity in the State to about 1010 MW at the end of the IV Plan.
