

(c) the steps taken by Government to finance these cooperative sugar factories?

THE MINISTER OF FINANCE (SHRI SACHINDRA CHAUDHURI):

(a) and (b) It is not a fact that the Industrial Finance Corporation of India has, as such, refused to finance the newly licensed co-operative sugar factories in Maharashtra. The Corporation has, however, not been able in recent months to process applications from sugar co-operatives on a large scale in view of the difficult resources position of the Corporation in the context of heavy demands made on it from other priority industries as well.

(c) The position is under review and the Government will endeavour to provide the Corporation with the necessary additional resources to the extent possible.

†CENTRAL ALLOCATION FOR ANTI-WATER-LOGGING OPERATIONS IN U.P.

692. SHRI SITARAM JAIPURIA: Will the Minister of IRRIGATION AND POWER be pleased to state:

(a) the total amount allocated to the State of Uttar Pradesh for anti-waterlogging operations during the year 1966-67; and

(b) whether the Government propose to enhance this amount in view of the recent drought conditions in Uttar Pradesh?

THE MINISTER OF IRRIGATION AND POWER (DR. K. L. RAO):

(a) An amount of Rs. 100 lakhs has been allocated as Central loan assistance to the Government of Uttar Pradesh for financing Flood Control, anti-waterlogging and drainage schemes in the State during 1966-67. No separate allocation has been made for anti-waterlogging schemes as such.

(b) No request has been received from the State Government for enhancing the allocation on account of anti-waterlogging operations.
