TEA EXPORT

- *625. SHRI G. R. PATIL: Will the Minister of COMMERCE be plsased to state:
- (a) the total quantity of tea exported to United Kingdom during the years 1963-64, 1964-65 and 1965-«6;
- (b) whether there has been a la^ in export during these years, as compared to Ceylon; and
 - (c) if so, the reasons therefor?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE (SHRI M. SHAFT QURESHI): (a) to (c). A statement is laid on the Table of the House.

STATEMENT

(a) and Ob). Exports of tea to the United Kingdom from India and Ceylon were as follows: —

- (c) The decline in exports from India to the U.K. in 1965-66 was mainly due to the following reasons:
 - (i) Reduced availability of tea in India for exports owing to a fall in production of about 7.6 million kgs. caused by prolonged drought conditions in North East India and seizure by Pakistan of about 3 million kgs. of tea in September, 1965 at the time of the hostilities;
 - (ii) Rising pressure of increasing internal consumption in India, a factor which does not exist in Ceylon.

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF RAILWAYS (SHRI SHAM NATH): (a) No. Sir. However, a suggestion to this effect has been received from the Managing Director of the Fertilizers and Chemicals, Travancore Limited.

(b) Doubling on the section is not justified at present. However, steps
