

Modernisation of Delhi Hospitals

2027. SHRI RAJU PARMAR: Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that condition of most of the Government hospitals in NCT of Delhi is far from satisfactory;

(b) if so, the reasons therefor;

(c) whether Government have allocated sufficient funds for modernization of hospitals in Delhi;

(d) if so, the details in this regard; and

(e) how many hospitals are likely to be opened before the next Commonwealth Games in 2010?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (SHRIMATI PANABAKA LAKSHMI): (a) to (e) No, Sir. Health being the State subject it is for the State Governments to monitor the conditions of the Hospitals in their States. The Central Government Hospitals in NCT of Delhi are functioning satisfactorily and quality of services is maintained at all levels. The services at OPD, IPD, Emergency and other basic facilities are provided free of charge to the patients. All the medical life supporting/essential equipments are available in the working condition in the hospitals. The modernization of hospital is a continuous process and the same is undertaken as per the need and available resource. Funds are provided for procurement of modern equipments on the basis of requirement of hospitals and availability of funds. There is no proposal under consideration of Central Government to open new Central Government Hospitals in the next Commonwealth Games in 2010.
