SHRI D. L. SEN GUPTA: May I know, Sir, what was the urgency for such a club because there are many pla es where there is no club for the officers, and particularly when we are hard up for money?

SHRIMATI INDIRA GANDHI: Well, -this was started some time ago. The piace, Jaduguda, is over 50 kilometres east of Jamshedpur, and it is a place where there are no basic amenities available. Before the construction of the mill and the development of the mine, this was a barren and thinly populated village.

SHRI N. R. M. SWAMY: Some offices are being housed in a Jcuchcha. building wherein the people cannot stand the heat of the weather, and while so, what is the urgency of having a recreation club for the staff?

SHRIMATI INDIRA GANDHI: Well, recreation is important for efficient working, and it is part of the general building scheme. There it has 1181 units of accommodation. We also had to build for a school, a hospital, a shopping centre, a bank, a post office, a community centre and an apprentices' hostel along with the two clubs which I have mentioned before.

SHRI P. K. KUMARAN: May I know. Sir. whether entry into this recreation club is restricted to officers, or is it available to other employees also?

SHRIMATI INDIRA GANDHI: I just mentioned that there are two separate clubs. One is the officers' •club which also includes a guest house

for visitors, and the second is the workers' club which will cater for the rest of the personne<sup>1</sup>. that is about 800 in number plus their families. and both have got facilities for indoor games, a hall for social gatherings, •etc.

## MEMORANDUM FROM MARATHI FILM iNUUSTRY

•303. SHRI S. K. VAISHAM-PAYEN: f SHRIMATI TARA RAMCHANDRA SATHE:

Will the Minister of INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING ba pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that a delegation of Marathi film industry submitted a memorandum containing their demands to Government in September, 1966; and
- (b) if so, what action Government propose to take in the matter?

THE MINISTER OF INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING (SHRI RAJ BAHADUR): (a) and (b) The Marathi Film Producers have invited the attention of Government certain difficulties to encountered by them in, regard to incidence of taxation, increased exhibition facilities and financial assistance for production of films. Government is already seized of these oroblems which are common to the film Industry and is considering measures to alleviate the hardships to the extent practicable which will facilitate production and exploitation of films.

SHRI S. K. VAISHAMPAYEN: One of the demands of the Delegation has been about recognition to their two associations, namely, the Marathi Film Producers As-ociation, and the Marathi Film Distributors Association. Wi'l the Government consider giving such recognition immediately?

SHRI RAJ BAHADUR: Sir. so far as the recognition is concerned, we have no such system of rTognismg such associations. The associations that com" into being correspond with us and we certainly respond to that . correspondence.

SHRI S. K. VAISHAMPAYEN: The MaraUu *turn* iuaaiuy nas not still c^nie under the influence of the Big Finance, nor ha., me evil of Star system affected it. As a result, the Marathi Alms are of a good standard. But they are facing a crisis because of no.i availability of theatres and the exorbitant ren.s. Will the Government take steps to check these exorbitant rents and save the industry?

SHRI RAJ BAHADUR: The pra-blims that ha has mentioned are factually correct and I do share with him that leeling. So far as the question of maintenance of standards by the Marathi fi ms is concernei, I do take notice of the fact that they are trying to do it.

SHRI D. THENGARI: Regarding relaxation in taxation, has any decision been taken by the Government?

SHRI RAJ BAHADUR: There are two demands; one ij that the rate of excise duty should be reduced, and the other is that there should be complete exemption. The Finance Ministry has not accepted that in view of the present economic situation. But we have re'ent'y put forward a proposal that purpos've films with social, national and also artistic merits and excel'ence should be considered for exemption from c^rtam taxes, and in that context we propose to take up the question again with the Ministry of Finna"e and al<\*-i with the State Government concerned.
