डा० राम समग सिंह: जहां तक आव-श्यकता महसूस करने की बात है इसमें दो राये नहीं हैं। आवश्यकता हम महसूस करते हैं। लेकिन अभी रेगिस्तानी इलाकों में जो हम टैंक वैगन से पानी भेजते हैं उसके लिये अभी कोई इस तरह का किसी जोनल रेलवे से सुझाव नहीं आया है कि वहां अलग से कोई इंतजाम किया जाय।

श्री सुन्दर सिंह भंडारो : क्या इन कर्म-चारियों की तरफ से कोई प्रतिवेदन इस सम्बन्ध में मंत्री महोदय के पास आया है ?

डा० राम सुभग सिंह: अभी मूल प्रश्न के भाग (ख) के जवाब में मैंने बताया कि रेगिस्तानी क्षेत्रों में विशेष भत्ता देने के लिये कोई आवेदन या प्रतिवेदन नहीं मिला है।

श्री सन्दर सिंह भंडारी : क्या में यह मान कि अगर इस तरह का कोई प्रतिवेदन मंत्री महोदय के पास आये तो इस संदर्भ में वे उचित विचार करेंगे ?

डा॰ राम सभग सिंह : असल में रेल के कर्मचारियों के लिये जहां कहीं भी वे कठिन स्थिति में काम करते हैं हम लोगों की पूरी हमदर्दी है और उनकी कठिनाइयों को दूर करने के लिये हम यथाणकित उपाय करते हैं। लेकिन अब इस सवाल में चिक उनका कोई प्रतिवेदन नहीं आया है, इसलिये माननीय सदस्य जा कर के उनसे कहें कि तुम अपना प्रतिवेदन भेज दो तो पता नहीं वह कहां तक ठीक होगा।

DR. RAM SUBHAG SINGH: Well, Sir, I can straightway say that wherever a railway station exists, it is our concern lo singly water and we will not allow a situation where they are made to purchase water, if they are living in the station precincts.

SHRI B. K. P. SINHA: May I know, Sir, if any scientific study has been made by the Ra lway Min s ry about the cab-ries required by a person living in the desert areas, to keep himself in good health? What type of diet would he need to keep himself in perfect health? What calories would be require?

DR. RAM SUBHAG SINGH: We know about India as a whole aud on that basis we go on.

#### POWER TILLER PROJECT ON PUNJAB

- •31. SHRIMATI LALITHA (RAJA-GOPALAN): Will the Minister of INDUSTRY be plea ed to refer to the reply given to Starred Question No. 207 in the Rajya Sabha on the 24th February, 1966 and
- (a) whether the Central Government have since accepted the Punjab Govern-

ment's proposal to set up a power tiller factory in public sector; and

(b) if so, whether the factory has been set up?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF INDUSTRY (SHRI BIBUDHENDRA MISRA): (a) and (b) A statement is laid on the Table of the Sabha.

#### STATEMENT

(a) and (b) The Government of Punjab have submitted two alternative proposals for the manufacture of posve/ tillers, one in collaboration with a Japanese firm and the other with the Central Mechanical Engineering Research Institute, Durgapur.

la the case of the scheme involving collaboration with Central Mechanical Engineering Research Institute, the Government of Punjab have been given time upto 30-9-66 for submitting a deta led scheme. In the meantime, their scheme involving Japanese collaboration is being examined.

SHRIMATI LALITHA (RAJAGO-PALAN): According to the statement, the Government of Punjab have been given time up to 30-9-66. The Central Mechanical Engineering Research Insdute is to submit a detailed scheme. The policy of the Government is to give incentives to internal producers, whether in the private sector or public sector. So. why should they consider at the same time having Japanese collaboration, when a time-limit has been given to our Engineering Institute up to 30-9-66?

SHRI BIBUDHENDRA MISRA: These were two separate proposals. As a matter of fact, there have been many collaborations with Jaoan c-o far as power tillers are concerned. So far as the Central Mechanical Engineering Re search Institute. Durgapur, is concerned, both the U.P. Government and the Punjab Government want to put up a composite scheme with hundred per cent indigenous content. They are makm-i that attemnt. Since the scheme is not ready the Punjab Government has asked for extension of time.

श्री विमलकुमार मन्तालालजी चौरिङ्ग्याः क्या श्रीमान यह बतलायेंगे कि यह पावर टिलर्स के निर्माण के कार्य के बारे में अभी जो विचार चल रहा है, वह कब तक पूरा हो जायगा ? दूसरी बात यह है कि बन कृषि मंतालय से भी इस प्रकार के पावर टिलर्स के उपयोग के बारे में अच्छी तरह से जांच करवा ली जायेगी इसके निश्चित करने से पूर्व ?

SHRI BIBUDHENDRA MISRA: All these power tillers, for which manufacturing licences have been given, have ueen tested in the test house and have oeen certified by the Ministry of Food and Agriculture also.

SHRI I. K. GUJRAL: Could 1 ask the hon. Minister what is the estimated requirement of power tiliers in the country and what is the total installed capacity, which the Ministry proposes to set up by the end of next year?

SHRI BIBUDHENDRA MISRA: So far as the target is concerned, no target was fixed for the Third Plan. Now, the estimated requirement roughly, by the end of the Fourth Plan, will be somewhere in the region of 60,000 or 75,000 and so far licences hav? been issued for the manufacture of 60,000 per annum.

- (a) whether it is a fact that Council of Scientific and Industrial Research objected to the issue of licence for import of Television sets;
- (b) whether it is also a fact that Council of Sc'entific and Industrial Research had submitted a detailed scheme for manufacture of television sets in India and that foreign exchange for the scheme was not granted to them; and
- (c) if replies to parts (a) and (b) above be in the affirmative, what are the reasons therefor?
