

**PAYMENT OF BONUS TO INDUSTRIAL UNITS
AT KANPUR**

178. **SHRI A. D. MANI** : Will the Minister of LABOUR, EMPLOYMENT AND REHABILITATION be pleased to state :

(a) whether it is a fact that some 25 industrial units of Kanpur have failed to pay bonus to their workers under the Payment of Bonus Act ;

(b) if so, the names of the industrial units which have failed to pay bonus ; and

(c) what steps have been taken by the Government against the defaulting firms ?

THE MINISTER OF LABOUR, EMPLOYMENT AND REHABILITATION (SHRI JAGJIVAN RAM) : (a) to (c) No reports of non-payment of bonus by units falling in the Central Sector at Kanpur have been received. The Government have no information concerning the remaining units which fall in the State Sector.

**BORDER DISPUTE BETWEEN MYSORE AND
MAHARASHTRA**

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI JASUKHLAL HATHI) : (a) and (b) It is understood that the Chief Minister of Mysore has stated that it would be possible for the two Chief Ministers to settle the matter across the table on the basis that minor adjustments are to be made. This statement was made by the Chief Minister of Mysore to some press correspondents some time ago. No formal proposals to the above effect have been made.

**J. AND K. GOVERNMENT'S SUGGESTION FOR
CITIZENSHIP AND FLAG FOR THE STATE**

THE MINISTER OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI GULZARILAL NANDA) : (a) No proposals to abolish the special privileges of the permanent residents of Jammu and Kashmir State or the separate flag of the State have been made by the State Government.

**EXEMPLARY DUTY SHOWN BY THE
POST MASTER, SHANTIPUR**

(a) whether any report has been received about the sense of duty shown by the Post Master at Shantipur in Krishna Nagar District of West Bengal during the burning of Shantipur Post Office during Bengal Bandh agitation in March, 1966 ; and

(b) if so, what is the estimated amount of cash and stamps that were saved by the post Master ?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENTS OF PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS AND COMMUNICATIONS (SHRI JAGANNATH RAO): (a) Yes Sir.

(b) Cash and stamps amounting to Rs. 15,795-90 were saved by the Sub-Post-master.

SCHOOL ATLAS

184. SHRI BANKA BEHARY DAS: Will the Minister of EDUCATION be pleased to state:

(a) whether the Survey of India has published a school atlas and if so, when;

(b) whether any agreement was entered into with a private firm for publication and sale of the said atlas; and

(c) if so, what are the terms and whether tenders were called for the same before signing this agreement?

THE MINISTER OF EDUCATION (SHRI M. C. CHAGLA): (a) Yes, Sir. First published in 1961; reprinted in 1962; reprinted with minor corrections in 1963; reprinted with further corrections in 1964.

(b) Two private firms have been allowed to publish their own editions of this atlas on payment of royalty.

(c) No tenders were called as no exclusive rights have been given. Royalty will have to be paid at the rate of Rs. 4,000/- per sq. metre of Survey of India map used, and Rs. 2-50 for every 5 sq. cm. for portions less than one sq. metre. These charges are payable for every print order of one lakh copies or part of a lakh. The charges are payable separately for each language in which the atlas is published.

PROMOTION TO THE POST OF PRINCIPALS IN DELHI

185. SHRI JAGAT NARAIN: Will the Minister of EDUCATION be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that certain candidates who were disapproved by the Promotion Committee of the Directorate of Education Delhi Administration, Delhi for the posts of Principals in 1965 for Government Schools were subsequently retained or promoted to the posts of principals by the Director of Education, Delhi; and

(b) if so, the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF EDUCATION (SHRI M. C. CHAGLA): (a) Yes, Sir. There have been some such cases of retention promotion on a purely temporary and *ad hoc* basis.

(b) According to the information furnished by the Delhi Administration, during this period 11 teachers (including 5 lady teachers) were promoted on a purely *ad hoc* and temporary basis and not on regular basis. They will be reverted as soon as regular candidates become available.

COMPENSATION TO PERSONS AFFECTED BY PUNJABI SUBA AGITATION

(a) whether the Central Government have subsidised the State Government of Punjab for payments made to compensate those who were affected during the recent Punjabi Suba agitation; and

(b) if so, the amount of the subsidy given and how many persons have been benefited therefrom?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI JAISUKHLAL HATHI): (a) No, Sir.
