#### NUMBER OF ROAD-WORTHY BUSES WITH D.T.U.

220 SHRI M. P. BHARGAVA: Will the Minister of TRANSPORT, AVIATION, SHIPPING AND TOURISM be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that the number of road-worthy buses with the Delhi Transport Undertaking on 31st March, 1966 is less than the number on 31st March, 1965; and

(b) how many buses were purchased during 1965-66?

THE MINISTER OF TRANSPORT, AVIATION, SHIPPING AND TOURISM (SHRI N. SANJIVA REDDY) (a) No, Sir.

(b) Order for purchase of 73 buses was placed during the year 1965-66. However, 67 buses were added to the fleet of the Delhi Transport Undertaking during that year.

#### WHEAT AND GRAM PRICES IN PUNJAB AND RAJASTHAN

221. SHRI JAGANNATH PRASAD PAHADIA: Will the Minister of FOOD, AGRICULTURE, COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AND COOPERATION be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that the prices of wheat and gram have gone high in Punjab and Rajasthan since the declaration of new zones recently, and

(b) if so, to what extent?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF FOOD, AGRICULTURE, COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AND COOPERATION (SHRI P. GOVINDA MENON): (a) and (b) The new zone for wheat and gram consists of Punjab, Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh and Delhi (excluding the rationed area in respect of wheat) and the position of Rajasthan has remained unchanged. A statement showing the wholesale market prices of wheat and gram at the various centres in Punjab and Rajasthan prior to and after the formation of the new wheat zone is placed on the Table of the Sabha. (see below). While there has been a rise of prices in some centres, there was a decline at certain other centres.

**MARINE LEG OF SILO AT KIDDERPORE DOCKS**

222. SHRI SUNDAR SINGH BHANDARI: Will the Minister of FOOD, AGRICULTURE, COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AND COOPERATION be pleased to state:

(a) when was the 'Marine Leg' of the 'Silo' installed at Kidderpore Docks, Calcutta port;

(b) whether it is a fact that the 'Silo' is now lying idle having gone out of Commission;

(c) if so, since when it has been lying idle;

(d) the reasons for its having gone out of Commission; and

(e) by when it is expected to be again put into working order?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF FOOD, AGRICULTURE, COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AND COOPERATION (SHRI P. GOVINDA MENON): (a) The 'Marine Leg', in conjunction with the Belt Conveyor, was ready for first trial in March, 1965.

(b) to (e) The silo at Calcutta was out of commission from the middle of February, 1966 to about the middle of April, 1966 as the electrical wiring system in the magnetic head pulley of the belt-conveyor feeding the silo was burnt out. The element was repaired by the Calcutta Port Commissioners pending receipt of a spare pulley from the U.K. and the silo and the equipment have been continuing to operate since the middle of April, 1966.
