## STATEMENT

(a) In 1965-66, All India Ctop. Com petitions have been conducted in two crops, paddy and wheat. The results of these competitions have not been announc ed so far as the yield data from some of the States has not been received.

Crop Competitions at State level arc conducted by some State Governments. Results regarding the winners of State level competitions have not been received so far.

(b) The prizes awarded to the first three winners of All India Crop Competitions are Rs. 3,000, Rs. 1,200 and Rs. 800 res pectively.

According to the scheme formulated by the Ministry of Food and Agriculture, the prizes for competitions conducted by State Governments for the first three winners are Rs. 2,000, Rs. 1,000 and Rs. 500. The actual amounts however slightly vary from State to

GOVINDA MENON): (a) and (b) The Agency for International Development of the Government of the United States of America have allocated 4,500 metric tons of dry milk powder to the UNICEF for distribution

in India under the latter's auspices as part of the general scarcity relief thei including supplementary feeding for vulnerable groups of the population. About 1,000 tons of this milk powder is intended to cover shortfalls in UNICEF's requirements for its existing milk distribution programmes and for the maintenance of normal operational reserves. The balance is for expansion of the existing programmes or establishment of new ptogrammes in scarcity affected areas.

## DREDGER-CUM-SURVIY LAUNCH Poor

## STATEMENT

(a) Yes, Sir. The survey launch pool has been functioning sine- 1962 when six launches were acquired. The launches have been carrying out survey work every year according to the programme approved by the Government of India.

As regards the dredgers, two 22 inch cutter suction dredgers wens ordered. The first of them is ready for dredging operations and is on its way to Bhaynagar for operations at that Port. The second ger is expected to be ready by the end of the vi

(b) The primary object is to assist the State Governments in maintaining the minor and Intermediate Ports in a state of operational efficiency. The survey launch pool carries out hydrographic surveys of the ports. The dredgers are intended to deepen the outer harbours and the bars at the entrance to ports.
