THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI P. S. NASKAR): Promotion to a post is made in accordance with the provisions of ihe Recruitment Rules framed for that post Normally only these officers of the lower grade are made eligible for promotion to a post in the higher grade, if their experience in the lower grade is of use in the higher grade. While this applies to Assistants/U.D.Cs. in case of promotion to posts of Superintendents, it is not applicable to Stenographers. They have been made eligible for promotion to posts of Superintendents to give them reasonable prospects, but in the interests of efficiency it is considered essential that they should some experience gain Assistant/U.D.Cs. before such promotion.
