

Kerala and Andhra Pradesh has been completed and the new factory proposed in Madhya Pradesh has been set up. On present estimates, this is likely to be towards the end of the Fourth Plan period. The exact location of the plant has not yet been decided. The initial capacity of this unit is expected to be Rs. 5 crores worth of machine tools a year.

FORWARD MARKETS REGULATION

632. SHRI BABUBHAI M. CHINAI: Will the Minister of COMMERCE be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that Government have appointed a Committee to inquire into the working of the Forward Markets Regulation Act; and

(b) if so, what are its terms of reference?

THE MINISTER OF COMMERCE

(SHRI MANUBHAI SHAH): (a) Yes, Sir. (b) The terms of reference are as follows: (i) to review the working of the Forward Markets Commission during the last 10 years, to find out the extent to which the Commission has been able to carry out the objectives as embodied in the statement of Objects and Reasons of the Statute; (ii) to assess the role that the forward markets can play in future in the light of the changed economic conditions in the country; (iii) to suggest amendments to the existing Act in order to effect improvements; (iv) to examine and suggest what other functions can be entrusted to the commission.

TRADE AGREEMENT WITH HONGKONG

(a) whether an agreement has been signed, between India and Hongkong to increase trade between the two countries; and

(b) if so, what are the details thereof?

1. M/s J. K. Rayon, Kanpur.
2. M/s. Telerad, Bombay.

(c) 10,000 sets per annum in each case.

(d) Ex-factory price about Rs. 800 (pre-devaluation estimate).
