THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF FOOD, AGRICULTURE, COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT COOPERATION (SHRI S. D. MISRA): (a) and (b) Government of Mysore proposed an outlay of Rs. 29.61 crores for State Plan Schemes including Advance Action Schemes during the year 1964-65 and 1965-66 against which a sum of Rs. 27.96 crores (including additional allocation) was allotted to them.

(c) The amount actually spent is estimated at Rs. 26.24 crores. This sum includes provisional figures of the amounts spent during 1965-66.

INDIA TOURISM DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION

(b) As against the estimated demand of about 1.5 million GRT. besides the replacement of obsolete tonnage of about 0.2 million GRT, during the Fourth Plan period, indigenous production is expected to be about 0.2 million GRT. It is not possible to indicate the gap in terms of the number and capacity of ships.

CENTRAL WAREHOUSES

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF FOOD, AGRICULTURE, DEVELOPMENT COMMUNITY AND COOPERATION (SHRI ANNASAHIB SHINDE): (a) 24 warehouses have been set up by the Central Warehousing Corporation during 1965-66.

- (b) As on the 31st March, 1966 the utilization of the Central Warehousing Corporation accommodation was 4 per cent, by the farmers and 59 per cent, by the traders.
