

engineer of the team subject to day-to-day inspection and control of the architects who designed the building. The engineers and architects are mostly young and enthusiastic and work closely together as a team.

Contracts are given on lump sum basis with adequate provision for profit after very careful and detailed costing of each building. Payments are made by stages without measurement and are more or less automatic and without delays. The contractors work honestly and efficiently and with the provision of adequate profits there is no attempt at reduction of standards or specifications on the part of contractors. With the construction of more and more buildings and the acquiring of technical and other skills, the cost of buildings has been gradually reduced by about 10%. Contractors are required to make their own arrangements for purchase of building materials. Government, however, takes care to advise the trade on overall requirements of building materials year by year so that they can plan imports in advance. Importers are given assistance wherever required to ensure that building materials are available in sufficient quantities. Direct imports are also undertaken in respect of any items which are not likely to be available through private importers.

The techniques of construction are all known to our architects and engineers. Given the same facilities of funds and building materials, we in this country could do equally well, if not better.

THE MINISTER OF WORKS AND HOUSING (SHRI MEHR CHAND KHANNA) :

(a) A Committee was set up to review the classification of the posts of industrial workers in the Government of India Presses into the categories of unskilled, semiskilled, skilled, highly skilled and supervisory and for the purpose of such review, to examine the qualifications and the field of recruitment/promotion laid down for each particular post and to suggest modification therein.

(b) Yes.

(c) The recommendations of the Committee are being examined.

SURVEY OF POWER REQUIREMENTS OF PUNJAB

(a) whether the Central Water and Power Commission has conducted any survey of power requirements and programme for power generation in the State of Punjab; and

Survey of Power requirements of Punjab

(b) The following steps have been taken to meet the gap between the

availability of power and its requirements in the Punjab during the Fourth Plan:

- (i) It is proposed to establish a large thermal power station at Badarpur (Delhi) with an initial capacity of 3x120 MW. Some of this power will be utilised to meet the additional load demands of this State.
- (ii) After the power programme of Fourth Plan is finalised, further steps will be taken to make up the shortage of power in Punjab.

FAVOURANCE OF DOUBLE TAXATION BETWEEN INDIA AND FRANCE

*171. SHRI NIRANJAN SINGH: Will the Minister of FINANCE be pleased to state whether agreement has been reached for avoidance of double taxation between the Governments of India and France and whether the balance of trade which was unfavourable to India has since improved?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE (SHRI RAMESHWAR SAHU) : No agreement has so far been concluded between the Governments of India and France for the avoidance of double taxation of income. The balance of trade between India and France continues to be unfavourable but at a lower level.
