ENGINEERING COLLEGE IN TRIPURA

*413. SHRI T. M. DASGUPTA: Will the Minister of EDUCATION be pleased to state whether any steps have been taken for starting an Engineering College near Agartala in Tripura in the current year?

THE MINISTER OF EDUCATION (SHRI M. C. CHAGLA)-. Yes, Sir. Government have approved the establishment of an Engineering College in Tripura with aa annual admission

capacity of 120 students (40 Civil, 40 Mechanical and 40 Electrical). The College was inaugurated on 15th August, 1965.

INTERNATIONAL INDIAN OCEAN EXPEDITION

*414. SHRI M. RUTHNASWAMY: Will the Minister of EDUCATION be pleased to state:

(a) what part Government took in the International Indian Ocean Expedition during 1961-1964;

(b) the number of Indian Scientists who were associated with that Expedition and whether any geologist was included among them; and

(c) whether the Expedition has resulted in findings that would help to promote the development of fisheries in the Arabian Sea and in the Bay of Bengal?

THE MINISTER OF EDUCATION (SHRI M. C. CHAGLA): (a) The Government planned and executed the Indian participation in the International Indian Ocean Expedition through its various agencies.

(b) About 200 Indian Scientists participated in the Expedition out of whom 14 were geologists.

(c) Information obtained on the physics, chemistry, biology and bottom features of the Bay of Bengal and Arabian Sea is likely to help locate fishing grounds and thereby promote the development of fisheries.
