would like to know what the position was in 1963-64. Five hundred sets were allocated for 1963-64 and we are trying to get more and more sets and we have already placed our indent on the Director-General S. & D.

SHRI BIREN ROY: Sir, in view of the unsatisfactory state of affairs- mountainous terrain, etc.—is it not possible to have completely foolproof sealed transistorised sets despatched to these places? It is possible to do that

SHHI C. R. PATTABHI RAMAN: Even sealed sets are affected by climatic conditions-rainy areas, especially in that place. Even that kind of sealing may not prevent the sets from getting out of order.

MR. CHAIRMAN; Mr. Roy thought it could be done.

SHRI BIREN ROY: Certainly, Sir, it could be done.

- •447. SHRI A. D. MANI: Will the Minister of Information and Broadcasting be pleased to state:
- (a) whether it is a fact that Government propose to appoint two overseas correspondents to cover the news for the All India Radio: and
- (b) if s'o, at what centres these correspondents are proposed to be appointed and what would be their jurisdiction in respect of news coverage?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF INFORMATION AND

BROADCASTING C. (SHRI R PATTABHI RAMAN): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) One will be stationed in Cairo to cover Africa and West Asia, while the other will be stationed in Hong Kong to cover South and South East Asia.

SHRI A D. MANI: May I ask the Minister whether the Government have worked out the cost of maintaining two correspondents abroad?

SHRI C. R. PATTABHI RAMAN: It involves foreign exchange. I am not able to give the correct figure.

SHRI A. D. MANI: May I ask the Minister whether it is necessary for the Government to have two special correspondents abroad, when particularly one of the Indian Agencies the P.T.I., is able to give extensive foreign coverage from its own correspondents?

SHRIMATI INDIRA GANDHI: Obviously we would not have sanctioned these posts if we had not considered it absolutely necessary. We are not satisfied with the coverage which we get from other correspondents.

SHRI A. D. MANI: May I ask the Minister why it has not been considered necessary to have correspondents in the African territories where there are Indian nations, like Kenya and Cevlon where there is a substantial population of Indian origin?

SHRIMATI INDIRA GANDHI: It is because of the shortage of foreign exchange that the number of correspondents which we had originally proposed was cut down.

- (b) These will be Set ^UP during the fourth Plan period. Their location has not yet been decided.
- (c) Yes, but bn a reduced scale on the lines of the Regional Labour Institutes already set up at Madras, Kanpur and Calcutta.
- SHRI S. C. DEB: May I know when the decision will be taken to set up and where they will be located?
- SHRI D. SANJIVAYYA: We have not yet taken any decision with regard to the location.
- SHRI S. C. DEB: May I know what would be the particular function of these institutes in these regions?
- SHRI D. SANJIVAYYA: In these Institutes we will have four divisions: j (1) I dustrial safety, health and wel- | far_e centre; (2) Industrial hygiene j and laboratory; (3) Library-cum-in- formation Centre; and (4) Training Centre.
 - SHRI S. C. DEB: May 1 know how the staff will be selected?
 - SHRI D. SANJIVAYYA: Normally we recruit through the U.P.S.C.
 - SHPI D. THENGARI: What factors will be taken into consideration while selecting the centres?
