development of industries in the territory, establish and manage industrial estates, develop industrial areas, assist industries financially, etc. The Bill has still to receive the assent of the President.

## SHORTAGE OF BABY FOOD

◆511. SHRI G. M. MIR: Will the Minister of INDUSTRY AND SUPPLY b'<sup>1</sup> pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that there is still great shortage of baby foo in the country; and

(b) if sfo, what action has been ■kaken by Government for stepping up the production of baby food?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF INDUSTRY AND SUPPLY (SHRI BIBUDHENDRA MISRA): (a) and (b) Yes, Sir. Additional capacity to augment the base for production has already been licensed, j All possible facilities are being aford-ed to the units licensed for production of baby food f<sup>or</sup> achieving early implementation.

## POSTS OF SUPERVISORS IN TRAIN LIGHTING DEPARTMENT OF RAILWAYS

\*512. SHHI B. K. GAIKWAD: Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to state:

(a) the number of posts of supervisors in the Train Lighting Depart-anent filled by promotions during the last five years on all Zonal Railways; and

(b) the number of persons belonging *to* Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes, promoted to such posts?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN TOE MINISTRY OF RAILWAYS (DR. RAM SUBHAG SINGH): (a) and (b) The information is being Collected and will be placed on the Table of the Sabha. •513. SHRI P. K. KUMARAN: Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to state:

(a) whether the diesel pump ope rators, working on the Indian rail ways have recently been re-classi fied and downgraded as semi-skilled workers;

(b) if so, what are the reasons therefor; and

(c) whether the change involves reduction in wages; if so, how many workers are affected?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF RAILWAYS (DR. RAM SUBHAG SINGH): (a) to (c) The information is being collected from Railways and the same will be laid on the Table of the Sabha in due course.

## GAZETTED STATUS FOR RAILWAY DOCTORS

\*520. SHRI NIRANJAN SINGH: Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to state whether it is a fact that doctors appointed under the Railways are not given a gazetted status; if so, the reasons therefor?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF RAILWAYS (DR. RAM SUBHAG . SINGH) : No, Sir. Doctors on the Railways are in the following classes:—

Class I—Chief Medical Officers and District Medical Officers.

Class II—Assistant Medical Officers.

Class III-Assistant Surgeons.

While classes I and II are gazetted categories, Assistant Surgeons in class III are non-gazetted; they are, however given honorary gazetted rank after completion of 5 years' service and promoted to class II after being duly selected and thus gain gazetted status in course of time.
