Will the Minister of LAW be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government propose to open a Branch Secretariat of the Ministry of Law in South India; and

(b) if the answer to part (a) above be in the affirmative, where this branch is proposed to be established?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF LAW (SHRI JAGANATH RAO): (a) and (b) A proposal for the establishment of a Branch Secretariat of the Ministry of Law (Department of Legal Affairs) at Madras is under consideration of the Government.

**ENQUIRY AGAINST KHADI GRAMODYOG
BHAWAN, DELHI**

*149. SHRI R. S. KHANDEKAR: Will the Minister of SOCIAL SECURITY be pleased to state:

(a) whether the enquiry against the Khadi Gramodyog Bhawan, Delhi, conducted by the Central Vigilance Commission, has been completed; and

(b) if so, what are the results of the enquiry?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF LAW (SHRI JAGANATH RAO): (a) No enquiry has been conducted by the Vigilance Commission against the Khadi Gramodyog Bhawan.

(b) Does not arise.

CAMEL MILK

*150. SHRI K. S. CHAVDA: Will the Minister of FOOD AND AGRICULTURE be pleased to state:

(a) the nutritive value of camel's milk; and

(b) whether it can be used in the same way as cow's and buffalo's milk?

THE MINISTER OF FOOD AND AGRICULTURE (SHRI C. SUBRAMANIAM): (a) Camel's milk contains on an average 31.1 percent fat, 4.0 percent protein, 5.6 per cent sugar and 0.75 per cent ash and should therefore be similar to cow's milk in nutritive value. Detailed work on the nutritive value of camel's milk has not been carried out in India so far.

(b) Though camel's milk resembles very closely cow's milk in composition, this milk has not been used extensively for fluid consumption. Some section of the nomadic people of Rajasthan have been using this milk and is also probably mixing it with other milks in this area. Since sufficient quantities of camel's milk are not available, its utilisation has not been possible to an appreciable extent.
