(3) EXPORT SECTOR

To provide the industry with world class infrastructure facilities for setting up their textile units, the Scheme for Integrated Textile Park was launched. The Textile Centres Infrastructure Development Scheme (TCIDS) and the Apparel Parks for Exports Scheme (APES) were merged to form this scheme. This scheme is based on Public-Private Partnership (PPP), and will equip textile units to meet international environmental and social standards. The Government of India support under the scheme by way of grant or equity shall be limited to 40% of the project cost, subject to a ceiling of Rs. 40 crore.
